Description:	<p>The U.S. Department of Transportation's Build America Bureau is soliciting applications for the Innovative Finance and Asset Concession (IFAC) Grant Program for FY 2024–2026. With up to \$45.98 million available, this competitive program supports state, tribal, and local governments, as well as public authorities, in developing organizational and technical capacity to advance public-private partnerships (P3s) for transportation infrastructure. The program offers two types of cooperative agreements: Technical Assistance and Expert Services. Technical Assistance awards provide resources to build internal capacity, perform asset scans, hire staff, and evaluate multiple existing assets for potential redevelopment through innovative financing or concession models. Expert Services awards provide funding for outside advisors to deliver project-level analyses, including feasibility studies, value-for-money assessments, revenue forecasting, permitting support, and concession negotiations. Eligible projects must involve the enhancement of existing transportation assets into TIFIA-eligible projects, which can include highways, bridges, freight and passenger rail, intermodal facilities, airports, ports, and transit-oriented development. Awards may be up to \$2 million, with projects of \$1 million or less funded at 100% federal share, and larger awards requiring a 50% non-federal match. The IFAC program is intended to facilitate innovative financing, leverage public and private investment, and ensure public benefits through greater private sector involvement in planning, development, and operations.
